Territorial Governors Summit

Snakebite, Territorial Governor

Well, another TG Summit has come and gone. Many items were debated and voted on. Some rather hotly I might add. The SASS was well represented this year with TGs from all parts of the country in attendance. This year the voting process was much improved, with actual counts taken. TGs that represent more than one club got to vote for each club that they represent. Many clubs who's TG couldn't make it, had "stand-ins". This resulted in a packed house. Issues that were voted on had to have been on the agenda, which was prepared in advance. Items from the floor were not voted on, but some discussion was allowed and the vote deferred until next year. Here is the jest of what was voted on and decided.

- You must now be a SASS member to shoot at State matches and above, and you must be from the state to be declared State Champion. The same rules apply to Regional matches.
- The RO courses are to be considered an interpretation of the Handbook.
- * The External Modifications committees recommendations were passed. They should be included in the next handbook. I will try to post them in the near future.
- * The recommendations of the Long Range committee were approved without any changes.
- Inconsistencies between the RO courses and the Shooters Handbook will be rectified.
- * It is recommended that in any scenario that includes dialogue, such as, "I'm coming Roy", that the dialogue be said before the clock starts and that the command, "Standby", be used before starting the clock. It seems that

- many of the things that the rest of the country is finally getting around to have been done at KRR for a long time.
- It is recommended that spotters be given a bandana, flag or some identifying item so the Timer knows who to listen to. Any other input is disregarded.
- * A new Category has been adopted. The 49er category will be for Traditional shooters between the ages of 49-59.
- One of the hot items on the agenda was to redefine the "Shoot till Dry" rule #8. This rule caused a lot of heartburn around the country. It was finally decided that if a shooter picked up the wrong gun, then cocked it, that he must fire that round. As soon as it is fired he receives a procedural, assuming that he doesn't already have one. He may then restage the gun and proceed with the stage or continue to fire it from his present location, or safely move to the proper location and fire. This applies to rifle and handguns. A shotgun that has been loaded will be allowed to be un-loaded, without penalty. The committee wanted no procedural, and to be allowed to reload any rounds that missed targets. In other words, NO MISSES, EVER, and NO PROCEEDURAL FOR SHOOTING OUT OF SE-QUENCE!! After the fight was over, we won this one.
- * Single barrel shotguns are now legal.
- Dropped ammo that lands on a table or prop may be picked up and loaded.
- Finally, the HOTTEST topic at the summit, define a "MISS". This was a war. I lead the charge in one direction, and got run over by a train coming the other way. After much discussion, this is what was presented by Quick Cal. "Rifle, Pistol, & Shotgun targets must be engaged with the appropriate type firearm. A miss is the failure to hit the engaged target using the appro-

priate type of firearm. It passed. Well, this isn't too bad for the rifle and shotgun, but I expect troubles with the handguns. All handgun targets are considered appropriate for handguns. It makes no differentiation between first and second handgun. A procedural will be awarded if the targets are shot out of order, but there will be no misses as long as the "APPROPRIATE" targets are hit. Appropriate meaning, Pistol targets with a pistol, Rifle targets with a rifle, and Shotgun targets with a shotgun. A shooter could put all rifle shots on one target, all shotgun shots on one target and all pistol shots on one target. and receive NO MISSES, and only one procedural. This means the RO is going to be put into the position of making a judgment call as to the reason the shooter didn't shoot the targets correctly. Was it a brain fade, or done on purpose for advantage? If so it would be a 30 sec Spirit of the Game penalty. I'm pretty sure that this will be addressed again next year, there is already a fair amount of heat on the TG wire about it.

Just an interesting note: It was proposed that the Wild Bunch be allowed to veto any rule change that they disagreed with! Since it was not on the agenda it could not be voted on, but if that passes it will kill the TG system.

The new rules will take effect at EOT 2002.

So there you have it. It is my duty to support and enforce the rules. I will do so to the best of my ability, and sincerely hope that you will too. Even if we disagree with some of them, we must have them enforced the same everywhere. Decide what you want done, and if I am still your representative I will fight for the change. This is still the best game in town. YEEEEE-HAAAW
