All these things must be coordinated into the master plan. Are you getting the drift? The high number of hours and energy level required to accomplish these tasks can't be supplied by just a few. It is going to "take a village" to maintain this pace. More work days are required to get the job done. Our Blacksmith has called for one on sat., Feb 28, 9am. Weather permitting. If you have a particular talent, such as artistic ability, carpentry, welding, or if you have access to materials that we need or can use, and are willing to share them with the club, let us know! Lumber (especially old barn wood), plywood, steel, rock & gravel are just some of the things we can use. One advantage of having a large membership is the diversity it brings. We must decide how far we want to go, and how fast we want to get there. We ARE the best because we work at it! It will take large scale participation, to keep the blossoms from falling, and to make the fruit grow.
