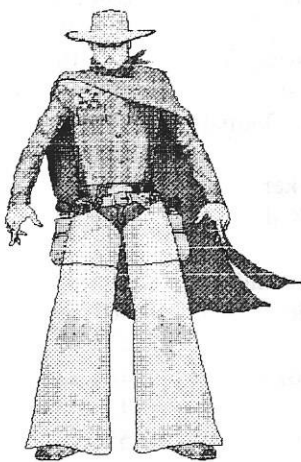
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Sundays job set up and executed by the Younger Gang!
