John Wayne Lives

...in our hearts and minds and at the 4th Annual John Wayne Shootout held on September 12th and 13th by the Chorro Valley Regulators. They have really done a lot of work at the range. the registration shack is all finished, that new sign Snakebite made really looks good, they have dirt berms between the bays and there are a whole bunch of new props and false fronts. A whole bunch of KRR's made the trek; Bear Paw, Toeless Joe, Long Feather, Wind Dancer, Geezer, Cole Chance, Jessie Montana, Square Shooter, Shiloh, Snakebite, Fannie Oakley, Buckskin, Yosemite Mam, Longbranch, Miss Kitty, Roughcut, River Dale, Shorty, Beanpot, Hank, Needa Tailor, Doc James, Frisco Frankie, Terrible Ted and Ruthless Ruth.

We were part of the 106 shooters that shot their way through 8 of the Dukes best westerns. Took out Quantral's Raiders in "Dark Command", fired the gatling gun on "Rooster Cogburn's" river raft (lots of movement on this one), defended the homestead (Tie a Yellow Ribbon), helped "The Horse Soldiers" secure the telegraph, blasted away with "The Shootist", blew up the "War Wagon", visited the carnival with "The Quiet Man" (that goose took a beating) and took shooting lessons from J. B. Books. All stages were challenging, well thought out and just like "The Duke" the good guy always won.

Rooster Cogburn's river raft was a real treat. A big raft that rolled and bucked as you walked around on it, with a gatling gun mounted on one rail. Started stage by cranking that gatling gun three times (Needa Tailor cranked so hard she broke the handle), shoot five pistol shots move to another part of the raft fire six shotgun, then your rifle and back to other side of raft for last pistol shots. That raft rocked and rolled enough to make you seasick.

Toeless Joe was the fastest shooter overall on this stage. ***Way to go Joe***

The Quiet Man, took us to a carnival shooting gallery. You started shooting a BBgun at tin plates, if you hit them

all you didn't have to shoot your pistol, but you did have to take your prize with you for the rest of the stage. The prize was a big stuffed goose and you had to hold it while you shot the rifle and shotgun. Most of us stuffed that critter between our legs, which must have been real inspiring for River Dale, cause he was the 2nd best shooter overall on that stage.

Snakebite was #2 overall on stage 4 and #1 overall on stage 5.

We had some really good shooters in our group, here's an example of the final standings:

Snakebite finished 6th overall and Longbranch was 11th overall.

Posse #5 mostly all KRR members (Riverdale, Beanpot, Bearpaw, Toeless Joe, Longfeather, Wind Dancer, Cole Chance and Jessie Montana) won the posse shoot!
