The August match will be a celebration of the 107th anniversary of the discovery of gold in the Far North, triggering a "rush" that rivaled, and in many ways outdid, those in California, South Dakota and Colorado years before. OK, so it's not an even anniversary, but it's worth celebrating anyway! The weather was tough, the mountains were high, the animals were mean and the men were meaner. Ne'er-do-wells the likes of the infamous Soapy Smith ruled the camps and creeks. Our August match will have a lot of those challenges...claim jumpers, marauding highwaymen, charging grizzlies, arctic storms, snow banks, and Soapy himself!
