
26" Oct barrels, Crescent butt stocks, and Ideal tang sights. Grandpa Onis bought the guns for himself and his two sons Billy and Bud. Onis ran a pack station in the Sierra at Mineral King out of Three Rivers and was a government trapper so the rifles got plenty of use. Back in the 50's Onis was the "Mountain Man" on the Mickey Mouse show that took Spin and Marty and the Triple R gang on the pack trips into the Si-

erra. I'm pretty sure I can spot one of the rifles in the video of the pack trip.

About a year ago I was talking to Sutter Lawman, SASS # 24333 and he told me about an old Winchester 30-



30 that he had re-bored and chambered to 38-55. He said it was a tack driver. With this tantalizing information fresh on my mind I gave my brother-in-law a call. After a good ol' Snake-oil sales pitch I talked him into coughing up two of the old Winchesters for re-boring. Upon completion of the job one gun would be returned to his safe and



the other would reside in my safe under the auspices of by better half, Fannie Oakley SASS #6719. Such a deal!

After searching the Internet and making a number of telephone calls I decided to send the barrels to Al Siegreist in MI. Al said it would be 4-5 months before he would set-up to make another run of 38-55s. I pulled the barrels and sent them off. Four months latter I had them back and they looked untouched, except the hole was bigger! I put the guns back together making sure not to disturb the 100year-old dirt and grime that was on the outside. Al did such a great job of restamping the barrels to 38-55 that they look original.

The bores slugged out at .377 with a 1 in 18 twist. I was now ready to start working up a load. My first try was an out of the book load of 16.9 gn of XMP 5744 under a 245 gn LFN bullet. I got into position on the bench rest and squeezed off 5 shots. WOW! The first 5 shots to come out of this new bore were within 1" on the 100 yd paper target. They weren't centered, but what a group! I just couldn't believe it. After scooting the group to the middle of the target I tried 35 gn of FF 777. Unbelievable, the results were the same. Next I tried some Ultramax factory ammo and again they grouped up. I could hardly wait to get in touch with by brother-in-law to hear his results. A week later his results were in. Same thing, he said it was the best shooting gun he'd pulled a trigger on. I now know why many Schuetzen-type target shooters choose this old 1884 Ballard round. It is accurate, easy to load and very easy to shoot. 3

Marlin chambered it's 1893 lever action in 38-55 as did Savage in their model 99. Both, along with the 94 Winchesters in this chambering have long since been discontinued. Over the years Winchester has come out with a couple commemoratives in 38-55, and Marlin now chambers it's 336 action in 38-55. Browning just recently dropped production of their 1885 High-wall in it, but Uberti still produces their High-wall in 38-55. H &

R (Marlin) and a number of custom shops here in the US also have offerings in this caliber.

In the late 70's Winchester introduced a "Souped-up" version of the old tack driver. It was the 375 Winchester in the Model 94 XTR Big Bore. Marlin, Savage and Ruger soon followed but by 1994 there were no rifles offered with this chambering. 375 Winchester ammunition will chamber and fire in a 38-55 with possible disastrous results. Pressures of the 375 cartridges can approach twice that of the 38-55. So be careful not to make a mistake.

A number of cowboy ammunition makers produce ammo for the 38-55. Most are LFP bullets in the 245-255 gn range with a velocity in the neighborhood of 1200 fps. The only mainline ammo that I found was a Winchester JSP. Buffalo Bore makes a hopped-up load using heat-treated 270 gn LFNGC bullets that zip out at 1900 fps with a whooping 2044 ft lbs of energy. At least whooping when compared to the normal 1400 ft lbs. I would be mighty careful what I shot them in.

If you are looking for a rifle caliber that is a pleasure to shoot I can certainly recommend the 38-55. This cartridge is well over 100 years old but will still do a good job on short to med range targets in the field. It is also a natural for the Cowboy Silhouette Matches and will be the "Belle of the Ball" at the Precision Rifle Match. This caliber can even be used in the Buffalo shoot though consistency past 400 yards gets pretty iffy. Check with your brother-in-law, and see what he has to offer. Enjoy!
