RAMROD'S MUSINGS

From the Pokey

What constitutes "In Hand" as far as handguns go?

This question arose from the act of the shooter getting ready to use the second handgun while still shooting the first.

The Rules Committee has defined "In Hand" as when the muzzle of the gun clears the top of the holster or when the muzzle of a staged handgun is lifted from the originally staged location.

What this means is, you can have your offhand on your handgun and have it fully gripped as long as the muzzle doesn't leave the holster or the staged prop.

This allows the non Gunfighter/B-Western shooter to quickly change handguns without being called for shooting out of category.

The Black Kid—plaque

"On June 2, 1900, Madera County's most infamous holdup occurred. On the corner, 100 yards from here, one bandit with a shotgun, blackened hands, face and a barley sack mask, robbed 4 stages, a freight wagon, lumber wagon and the officers of 2 troops of cavalry. The cavalry were 200 yards down the road but would have done little good, they had no bullets due to their rowdy ways while in transit. He gave a driver his card in case we ever meet again. Total take was \$280.00 from 34 men and 5 women. Time at scene, 2 1/2 hours. Suspected of other robberies through 1906. He was never caught."

Located on Road 600 Approx 1 1/2 miles west of Grub Gulch, CA

China Alley—plaque

"In 1874, 600 people moved to what is now Fresno; 200 were Chinese who made the brick and helped start the building of Fresno. A short time later, they were persuaded to settle west of the train tracks. They built an area of shops, which catered to tall ethnic backgrounds. It was a thriving area which offered goods, services and "entertainment" day and night. It was the cosmopolitan area of Fresno for many years and to this day, the area still has influence on the city. The 437 brick here came from an 80-plus year old church that was torn down in the '70's and is thought to have been made by the Chinese settlers."

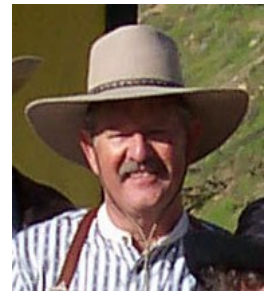

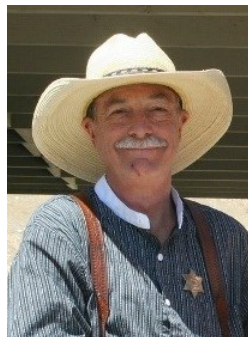
