The Official Agenda Items for the 2003 Territorial Governor Summit are as follows:

- 1)** Failure to stage guns or ammunition at the proper position is the fault of the shooter and will be scored as a single procedural penalty. The RO should assist the shooter with proper set-up, but the responsibility lies with the shooter. ***Otherwise the rulebook will reflect that the fault lies with the RO and will result in either no penalty for the shooter or grounds for a re-shoot.
- 2)** Failure to engage shall apply only to non-shooting functions called for within stage descriptions (i.e. throwing a rope, using a bullwhip).
- 3)** Dry firing and shadow shooting at the loading table will result in a stage disqualification. Dry firing may be done at unloading tables and other designated safe areas.
- 4)** Should the 49er category be changed to an open category as all other age-based categories are currently? Rather than its original intent which was to divide the Traditional category.
- 5)** Miss Rule Current Verbiage (passed 2001):
Rifle, pistol, and shotgun targets must be engaged with the appropriate type firearm. A "miss" is defined as the failure to hit the engaged target using the appropriate type firearm. Missed targets are scored as five-second additions to the competitor's raw time for the stage (at annual matches and above). If any targets are shot (hit) using the wrong type firearm, a single procedure penalty is assessed in addition to the miss.
Proposed Change:
Rifle, pistol, and shotgun targets must be engaged with the SPECIFIC firearm required by the stage instructions. A "miss" will be defined as a failure to hit the correct array of targets with the SPECIFIC firearm required by stage instructions. Target arrays shot (hit) using the wrong firearm will be scored as misses only. Target arrays shot (hit) in an order other than specified by the stage description with the correct firearm will be scored as a single procedure penalty plus incurred misses. Firearms shot out of sequence will result in a single procedure penalty plus incurred misses. Missed targets are scored as five-second additions to the competitor's raw time for the stage (at annual matches and above).
- 6)** Remove the restraints in the Gunfighter Category that require a Gunfighter to alternate pistols. Allow a Gunfighter to (if the stage is designed for a gunfighter to pull both pistols) pull both pistols and fire the guns in any order the shooter wishes. The Gunfighter still must engage the targets in the same order as shooters from other categories and may not holster a pistol with live rounds unless the pistol(s) were shot at the wrong position.
- 7)** Outlaw seating caps on a cap and ball pistol with the hammer of the pistol.
- 8)** "In a "cap only" Ignition, the Frontiersman should be allowed to continue firing the remaining chambers. On a complete failure to fire, the shooter should be allowed to hammer strike the cap a second time. If the cap does not go off with the second strike or in a "cap only" ignition, the firearm should be grounded or handed off to the RO. The firearm is in an unknown state and should not be holstered."
- 9)** Once an agenda item has been defeated by a two thirds majority of the Territorial Governors, the basic premise of that agenda item, however re-worded, cannot re-appear on the summit agenda for a period of three years. The Wild Bunch would have the authority to revisit any agenda item as necessary.
- 10)** Should clubs have the authority to require wrap-around style shooting glasses or require shooting glasses to have side shields for added safety.
- 11)** Shotgun shell slides may not be worn over shotgun belts or worn in any other manner that holds the shells away from the body.
- 12)** Allow the use of frangible bullets with the following provision.
 - a) That a committee must test, review and evaluate any brand of bullet submitted by a manufacturer so it meets all SASS established criteria.
