

Fort Miller 1999 is going to be an even bigger and better event than previous years, and will require the assistance of more club members than before. Right now, plans are being made for a 3 day event. As plans are finalized we will have a better idea where we would like your support. We will need plenty of folks to help set up on Thursday, help run the long range and side matches on Friday, and help with the main stages on Saturday and Sunday. If we can get enough of you to help, we can take turns and all of us will get a chance to shoot all the side matches.

One issue I want to share with you all at this point, is the idea of using volunteers to explain each of the eight stages during the shoot. At last Year's Mill Creek Shoot, KRR members (Terrible Ted, Ruthless Ruth and Geezer) ran the stage put on by KRR. They provided a description of the stage to each posse as they shot through. It worked well. We would like to do the same at Fort Miller 1999.

We would like volunteers to be in charge of each stage and explain the stage as each posse takes their turn. This provides for a more consistent interpretation of the stage for each



posse. The posse leader will still be responsible for timing, scoring and running his/her posse throughout the eight stages. You might be asked to rule on procedural penalties. What this means, is that you will not be shooting any of the main stages.

At our previous annual matches, some members came up to see the match as spectators, and some offered to help in some way. If for whatever reason you will be unable to sign up for Fort Miller 1999, but plan on attending Saturday and Sunday, please consider being the stage officer. For your services, we will make you a paid entrant, which entitles you to a shooter's package, draw for a shooter's prize, and participate in the long range and any of the side matches you care to try, at no charge. If you are interested, let me or the Mayor know. Thanks for the spirit.

Minutes General Meeting April 7, 1999

Meeting called to order at 7:00 p.m. at Old Fresno Hofbrau. Approximately 26 members and guests present.

Minutes of prior meeting read and approved.

Treasurer's report:

Beginning balance 6,664.73 Income 1,466.00 Expenses 2,094.92 Ending balance 6,035.81

Motion by Beanpot, second by Terrible Ted to accept treasures report. Report accepted.

Removal of DG for FRPC: Cole

Chance reported there was a cease and desist order to stop mining of decomposed garnet from the range. Cole Chance and Buckskin have submitted plans to FRPC for a construction project at the range. If the plan is accepted KRR will get a lot of improvements on our part of the range. Items include widening the berm between public range and our bay one and putting in new access road for the fire equipment, deepen bays #1 and #2, lengthen bay #7 by 35 yards and widen bay #8 by 8 feet and building berms up to 12 feet again. **High Sierra:** If you are planning to go give entry forms to Jessie Montana before Monday, April 12th, so she can send them all in together **Annual Match:** Will be a three day event, with one additional day of setup. October 21st-24th. Anyone who can help with Thursday setup, call Joaquin Rivers. Also need workers for side matches on Friday.

Door prizes – Need donations from club members, let Jessie Montana know ASAP if you will be donating items. Donate something you would like to win.

Discussed handing out shooter bags again. Generally felt this was a good idea.

Entry forms will be mailed to all, except club members, who attended last year. Flyers are being handed out at all shoots that members attend. Decided against putting ad in Cowboy Chronicles.

Snakebite will contact Starline about getting some 45-70 brass to put in shooters packets.

Long Range will be silhouette shoot and 500 yd buffalo shoot. Buckskin is working on sensor for Buffalo shoot. Electronics instructor at FCC is having students work on design.

Stage Masters for annual – Joaquin Rivers suggested trying to get club qualified club members, who for one reason or another don't plan to shoot, to volunteer to work as range master on a stage. A Stage Master would explain the stage to each shooter and assure that each person shooting the stage shoots the stage the same way. He will present idea to club members to see if we have any volunteers.

General Discussion:

Work party – Buckskin reported we got flagpole base in, trees pruned, drip lines fixed, laid out plans for trees and generally cleaned up range.


Goat ropers – Buckskin reported things worked well at last shoot, with Goat Ropers spaced between regular shooters. Discussed possibility of setting up web site for KRR. Snakebite and Ruthless Ruth will look into what it takes and what cost there may be to the club.

May Match: Joaquin Rivers discussed having a fun shoot in May, possibly shooting 8 bays, having side matches, BBQ, teamshoot, top gun shootout etc. Will work on plans. Need ideas for side matches, scenarios and *helpers!!* If you have any ideas let him know. Shorty made motion, Beanpot seconded, those present voted to have fun shoot in May.

Beanpot suggested the new name for the planning commission be Fort Miller Land and Development Co.. He reminded Cole Chance that he had offered a free shoot to anyone coming up with better name. Cole will take name under consideration.

Meeting adjourned.
