From the Pokey

Safety Violations -

What are safety violations? There are three categories of safety violations: 10-second minor safety violations, Stage Disqualifications, and Match Disqualifications.

• 10 second minors are:

Not leaving a long gun action open.

Leaving empty or live rounds in the magazine or carrier of the

long gun.

Loading more than the correct number of rounds in a long gun. Not returning pistols to leather unless otherwise specified. Carelessly placed open, empty long guns that slip and fall but don't break the 170.

Retrieving a dropped "dead" round.

Stage Disqualifications are:

Any dropped UNLOADED gun on the firing line (between loading and unloading tables)

Any accidental discharge deemed unsafe (including at the loading table)

Accidental discharge striking anything five to ten feet from the shooter.

Violation of the 170 rule.

Returning a handgun to leather with the hammer not fully down on a spent round or empty cylinder.

A cocked pistol leaving the shooters hand (this means switching hands with a cocked handgun also)

Leaving a live round in the chamber of a long gun.

Changing location with a cocked gun or a gun with the hammer down on a live round.

Unsafe firearm handling, such as fanning.

Loading at other than the designated loading position or firing line. Use of an illegal or illegally modified firearm.

Use of illegal items.

Holstering or staging a pistol with the hammer down on a live round.

Sweeping anyone with an unloaded firearm.

Failure to adhere to loading and unloading procedures.

• Match Disqualifications are:

Two accumulated Stage Disqualifications or Two Spirit of the Game assessments.

Belligerent attitude / Unsportsman-like conduct.

Shooting under the influence. Alcohol, Drugs (prescription or other).

Shooting illegal ammunition e.g. too hot.

Dropping a loaded firearm.

Accidental discharge striking within five feet of the shooter.

Sweeping anyone with a loaded firearm.

For further insights into what these are, take Snakebite's ROI course. It will make a safer shooter out of you.



Salute to Captain Mace

April 24, 1894. . . oops, April 24, 2004 With the help of KRR and SASS members, a century-old injustice has been corrected. Captain Russell Perry Mace, described as "Madera's First Citizen" finally got the headstone he richly deserved.

SASS member Milt Gauthier and KRR members Levi Longneck, Wildcat John, Coarsegold Kid, Texas Ed, T.O.Slo, and Crusty Jim, under the command of Talon Hawke, provided a 21-gun salute to Captain Mace at the dedication of his new headstone at the Arbor Vitae Cemetery in Madera.

Captain Mace was born in 1820 and led a dream life, if you're a fan of the old west. He traveled west as a young man, went to sea, fought in Mexico, hunted buffalo, scouted, was elected to public office and became the owneroperator of Madera's first hotel, The Yosemite, in 1878. He died on April 24, 1894.

The sixth-grade class of Madera's extraordinary teacher, Bill Coate, had discovered that Captain Mace's grave was marked only with a concrete slab with his name pressed in it. Graves of the Captain's children, who died after him, had proper headstones. Mr. Coate's class took on the task of getting a proper marker for the Captain. Through their efforts, Raymond Granite Company donated the stone. Mark Peruch, a local monument carver, etched the stone. The Madera Cemetery District provided the mounting of the stone and the entire event was under the direction of Dan Whistler of Jay Chapel. Ancestors of the owners of Jay Chapel had actually performed the original services for Captain Mace in 1894.

Mr. Coate's class of nineteen students recited a brief biography of Captain Mace for those attending. The local Masonic Lodge performed a ceremony for Captain Mace, who also was a Mason.

On April 24, 2004, the new headstone was dedicated and the 21-gun salute arranged by Levi Longneck and Wildcat John was performed in front of the attendees. Wildcat's blanks performed flawlessly, and the crowd was properly impressed. All of the riflemen shot various breeds of 45-70's. As a memento of the occasion, Wildcat John offered up the empty brass to the members of Mr. Coate's class. There were just enough empties to go around.

It was a good day, even if it was Boot Hill.
