ROI and ROII Classes...

The single most important thing you, as a shooter, can do is keep current on the rules and how to play the game.

The best way to do this is take the ROI/II Classes when they are offered.

The Rules, and Interpretation of the Rules, change and get updated often and the best, only way usually, is to take a class.

When was the last time you set in on an RO Class? Can't remember? Then it's time to take another.

SASS has made a change on the ROI/II pins. Every time you re-certify, SASS will send you a date rocker for your pin.

This date rocker will tell everyone you have taken the initiative to keep current and the year you did so.

The next ROI/II Classes in our area will be at the SASS Western Regional Championship.

Re-certify, it's the right thing to do.

Cowboy Logic -

Timeline Time...

1888–1889

January 22, 1888: Stagecoach bandit **Black Bart** is released from San Quentin on good behavior.

1889: For the next 20 years of his life, **Fredrick Remington** will paint or sketch more than 2,700 iconic western-themed pictures.

1889: In Salem, Oregon, farm and labor representatives and prohibitionists meet to form a progressive Union Party.

1889: Telluride, Colorado, is the scene of **Butch Cassidy's** first bank heist.

1889: Kansas adopts legislation regulating trusts, the first sign of the agrarian-based Populist movement that is about to sweep across the West.

1889: The Ghost Dance movement has a resurgence when Paiute holy man **Wovoka** wakes from a trance to spark a

spiritual revival among Natives. The federal government interprets the movement as dangerous to U.S. interests.

February 3, 1889: "Bandit Queen" **Belle Starr** is gunned down near her Oklahoma Territory Home. Her killer will never be brought to justice.

March 2, 1889: By passing the Sioux Act, the U.S. government breaks up the Great Sioux Reservation. The government replaces it with six smaller reservations and opens the remaining land to white settlers.

April 22, 1889: In Oklahoma, two million acres of former Indian land is made available to white settlers. On this day alone, 50,000 white settlers swarm the territory to stake their claims.

September 16, 1889: **Bob Younger**, outlaw member of the **James-Younger Gang**, dies while imprisoned at the Minnesota State Penitentiary.




