#### Open Letter to the Kings **River Regulators**

It is not often that one gets the chance to view the past through the lens of the present, especially a past that many believe to be myth or legend. This was the experience that I had during our workday on Saturday, January 2<sup>nd</sup>. What I saw was the Regulators coming together for the common good, a purpose not unlike that which tamed a frontier and defined the American character. It does not take a lot of imagination to see the "can do' spirit of that day is the same spirit that raised barns, built bridges, cleared fields and brought civilization to the American West a hundred and forty years ago. This spirit is something unique to America's frontier, even Canadian experience was vastly different, and obviously it hasn't been completely lost. I watched at least four generations working to accomplish a task that most "carpetbaggers" thought we couldn't get done and we did it with style, on budget, and on time. I saw wives working with husbands, sons working with fathers to clear rocks from a field. This scene must have been duplicated tens of thousands of times on the frontier from Texas to Montana, Oregon to Kansas. Those who do not understand us think that we are cowboys for the fantasy of it. Those who know realize it's the connection to a unique heritage that binds us and we celebrate that heritage, not trivialize it. You do not need to have had a relative at the Alamo or have been born on a horse. It only takes an appreciation of individual freedom, and the ability to "Cowboy Up" when needed. The members of the Kings River Regulators have proven up to the task and, without exception, are the kind of people you can ride the river with.
