SASS RANGE OFFICER COURSE

The material is in, and being passed around. There will be an R.O. course conducted after the Saturday setup in April. There is a ten dollar fee for taking the course. Five dollars goes to SASS to cover the pins and postage, and five goes to the KRR to cover copies, postage, etc.

There will be an exam at the completion of the course, and you must pass it to receive your pin. I expect the course to last approx. 2-3 hr. You might want to bring a lunch.

If you want to attend, and didn't get the material at the setup or the match, you must get hold of me, or get a copy from someone else. Lets all get fired up about this and get as many through the course as possible. The more qualified, the better! See you there..SnakeBite.

Minutes of General Meeting of the KRR

Mayor Cole Chance called a meeting of the KRR members on Sunday March 19 after the shoot.

KRR Hats:

We got a look at a KRR baseball type cap, designed by Shiloh's wife Linda. Sample was a black hat with, silver brim, our cowboy logo in silver and red with KRR across it in red letters,, and Kings River Regulators in red stitching on the back. It's a good looking cap. Discussed possible other colors, possibly a blue, lighter weight material. Ask if there was any interest, there was, will probably have some made up. Cost will be around \$10.

May shoot:

It will be eight stages. Beanpot is doing lunch, Wanda Rowan may be there to keep Beanpot on track. Charge will be \$4 for Saturday sidematches and regular fees for Sundays shoot. KRR has to pay FRPC \$4 per day for each person shooting.

Saturday will be setup and side matches, potluck Saturday night. Events will be Plainsman, pocket pistol, one-on-one, long range (you can use sticks) and a team event put on by Sierra.

Overnight camping at the range will be allowed both Friday and Saturday night. Remember **FRPC is a dry range**, and we all know what that means.

Fort Miller 2000:

Cole Chance asked membership if they wanted to have a Fort Miller. Answer was a resounding yes. Cole stressed importance of all club

Discussed door prizes, possibly cutting down on number of big prizes, guns etc., in favor of more medium priced ones. If donations go as they have in the past will continue to give each shooter a shooters prize.
