**December Match Director

Territorial Governors Summit

Snakebite, SASS #4767 Territorial Governor

The second TG summit was held in Las Vegas a couple of weeks ago. There were 129 SASS CAS clubs represented. These representatives came together from all parts of the country bringing with them many ideas that helped to mold the rules by which SASS cowboys and girls play the game.

On Friday, the governors were presented with the new RO-II course. This course was developed to provide a more in depth knowledge to those that put on and run CAS matches. It covers Match Design, Match administration, as well as hands on technique used in ROing a posse. It also seeks to establish a more consistent propagation of the RO-I course by requiring all that teach the course be "CERTIFIED" as an RO-II. There will be only a few instructors available to teach the RO-II course thru out the country, and the fee for the course will be \$25. Needless to say, there are more details to be worked out. The really good news is this. Having completed and passed the RO-II course, I believe that the Kings River Regulators are already in compliance with 99% of what was taught. Our club is one of the best-run CAS clubs in the country. There is also an update to the RO-I course material and test on its way. I will keep you posted on things as they come to my attention. In the mean time, when there is enough interest, I will teach another RO-I class.

Saturday morning the main event got under way with a discussion of National programs and TG Policies. It began with a dogfight about whether or

not the votes at the summit would be binding or not. It was finally agreed that the votes would be binding, with a ratification of the governors that were not present. It was, however, noted that we had a majority of governors present, and that next year's summit would NOT require any ratification. It was noted that State Champions must reside in the state in order to be the State Champion. Regional Champions were not required to reside in the region. (???) The SASS Regulator selection process was discussed. The Summit date and location will remain the same next year. After clearing out this policy stuff, we got into the real meat of the meeting. Here are the Shooting and Range agenda items that were presented, along with their outcome. They will NOT become effective until they are ratified by the governors, and are printed in the Chronicle.

1. Minimum Velocity....No change. There is still no minimum velocity rule.
2. Specialty Main Match Categories...There is none. (i.e., no green eyed lefty class)
3. Long Gun Transport Policies...All long guns must be open! Even if covered or in scabbard. The match director can make exceptions if deemed necessary.
4. Ruger Single Sixes in .32 mag...Now legal in the Traditional Class.
5. USFA "Omni-Potent" revolver...Not a legal SASS gun
6. Shoulder Holster Angle... Must not exceed 30 degrees.
7. Shotgun Loops....May hold no more than two shells together.
8. Shotgun Staging Muzzle Down... Shotguns may NOT be staged with the muzzle down.
9. Failure to Fire Last Round... Ruled as a miss, unless intentional.
10. Main Match Holsters...Only one MAIN MATCH holster on each side of belly button. Must be at least two fists apart. Cannot have a shoulder holster and waist holster on

same side. This can be under local control except for sanctioned matches, or specific need.

11. Bandalier....May not be tied down or secured in any manner. It must be free to rotate.
12. Ammunition in Mouths... Ammunition may not be carried or placed in any body orifice.
13. Number of Main Match Handguns Carried to Line... Maximum of two.
14. Motorized Gun Carts on Range....Up to local control
15. Detailed List of Legal Mods...In committee should be out in February.
16. New Long Range Regulations.....In committee, should be out in February.
17. Female short sleeves...Non issue, should be appropriate to costume.
18. Cutaway Speed Holsters... Not allowed.
19. Splitting the Traditional Class...No
20. 50-59 Category....No
21. Subdividing the Senior Class further....No
22. Class by Handgun Caliber.... No
23. Class by Shotgun type....No
24. Moving with Cocked Gun.... You cannot move with a cocked gun. The basketball traveling rule comes into play. One foot must be planted. You can unholster and reholster while on the move unless the stage description says otherwise.
25. Shooting Glasses,...Small period type shooting glasses are discouraged.
26. New Shooter....Suggested that new shooters attend an orientation before first match.
27. Cartridge Loops....Only one cartridge per loop.
28. R.O'sAll RO's at state and above must have passed RO-I course.

Well, that is the jest of what went on. Some of the items created some hot debates, but nobody was shot.
