I know that this has been beat to death lately, but I've just got to hit it one more time. SPOTTING is one of the hardest and most important jobs at the match.

Some of you have heard my on-going joke that there is a group of "Lying, Blind, Cheating spotters that follow me around from match to match!" Well of course everyone knows that I'm joking, but the fact is there are a huge number of folks that end up in the spotting position that simply shouldn't be there. New shooters should not spot! They simply lack the experience needed to do a good job. They can, and should, spot on their own for a few matches to get the feel of it. Then, when they are ready, they can step up and become a qualified spotter.

The RO courses do not cover the spotting aspect of the game in enough detail. That is being looked at right now for a possible update. It is difficult to do a good job spotting when you are distracted or tired. Don't carry on a conversation while trying to spot. Give it your full attention. Get into a position that allows you to see what is going on, and one which gives you a good view of the targets. Don't hesitate to move around, but stay out of the shooter's way. Don't try to spot for long periods - it takes too much concentration to keep up. Give yourself a break and get relief from another competent spotter.

Remember to make your own call, and don't be upset or embarrassed if other spotters disagree with you, maybe their position allowed for a different view of what went on. The Timer/RO is in a unique position, being directly behind the shooter. I have read opinions that support the Timer/RO's decision, to report his view to the spotters when he has seen an edge hit. I suppose that this is ok, but must also point out that the good spotter has seen the miss before he/she called it. Everyone is on the side of the shooter, especially the Timer/RO. If you are a spotter, and the RO points out an edge hit, consider it, but stand your ground if you are absolutely sure of the miss. If the timer's remark casts any doubt whatsoever in your mind, don't hesitate to change your call. Discussion between spotters simply shouldn't happen.

What this all boils down to has been said many times over...."any doubt goes to the shooter." Shooters using black powder, and very fast shooters often get hit hard with spotting errors. I can't tell you how many times I've heard spotters say that they couldn't see the target because of the smoke, and they didn't hear the hit....so they called it a miss. Hearing a hit doesn't mean that the correct target was hit, or maybe even the frame was hit, but it is at least something that can be used to support the shooter. As a spotter you must assume that the shooter is aiming at the correct target, unless you know otherwise. If you hear a hit through the smoke you should assume that he hit the correct target. However, if you don't hear a hit you should NOT assume that he missed it! Soft lead and dead targets are both good reasons not to hear a hit.

Back to the basics...."If you don't know for sure that the shooter missed the target, then he hit it!" Spotting is a tough job and nobody is always right. However, if you are a spotter, and find yourself in a position where you don't know for a fact that a shooter missed a target, then give it to him/her. It is better to give a shooter a free miss than to take a true hit from him/her. This is the "Cowboy Way," and the way Spotters should operate.
